## It's Full Steam Ahead on Trail Corridor Improvements

Summer is peak construction season and we are taking full advantage of the sunny weather to make rapid progress throughout the corridor.

Structure work continues on the Land Park Underpass, with the primary focus at the southern approach, just east of Riverside Blvd. Earthwork operations will continue along the entire trail corridor. Depending on your location earthwork may or may not be visible from roadways, but please keep in mind this is temporary.

From now through mid-July, the contractor will:

- Continue removing miscellaneous fence, debris and other encroachments on the project corridor
- Continue constructing modular block walls to preserve existing oak trees
- Conduct fine earthwork grading along the length of the trail corridor
- Begin placing aggregate base material between Florin and Pocket roads to support new pavement
- Install underground drainage
- Fine grading of drainage swales along the trail corridor.
- Continue electrical improvements for traffic and pedestrian safety signals at six intersections which requires intermittent lane closures

along some roadways, but none will be closed to through traffic. This work will continue intermittently through the fall. The intersections are:

- 35th Avenue
- o 43rd Avenue
- Del Rio Road
- Fruitridge Road
- South Land Park Drive
- Sutterville Road

Install foundations for the new Willow Slough Bridge. This work will require pile driving, which will take no more than two days to complete. We will notify residents directly adjacent to this work one week prior to it starting.

With all the heavy machinery being used throughout the corridor, please adhere to the information on the construction signage. Some machinery can move deceptively quickly given its size so we place directional signage at each location to ensure the safety of you and your family.

## Please remember no public through-access on the alignment is permitted during construction.
